Hello TRACS Community!

In March, the [TRACS Working Group](#) met in Denver, Colorado to work on system enhancements. More information will be shared in upcoming newsletters.

Recent TRACS system enhancements:

- New geospatial layers are now available in TRACS, including **Texas Gould Ecological Regions** and **Tribal Areas and Subdivisions** for American Indian/Alaska Native/Native Hawaiian (AIANNH) areas. For more information about the tribal layers, visit the [Tribal Layers Announcement](#).
- In February the TRACS team conducted an annual review of the geospatial data layers in TRACS to obtain updated datasets for shared shapes and layers provided by state agencies. Some datasets have been received and are currently being processed. We will announce when the updated datasets are available.



TRACS Tip of the Month

Copying a Project

The Copy button allows you to copy some of the information in an existing project to a new project. This is useful when you have a well-written project that can be used again, such as an operations and maintenance (O&M) project from year to year.



After selecting the Copy Project button from the Guided Process Tool, you can determine whether to copy just the project properties, the project statement(s) and/or actions. After selecting an option, make sure to review what will or will not be copied to the new project on the right side.

Tip: The Copy button does not work from Legacy projects.
